Growing up in a family of four, being the second girl and the third born, Jernice knew the struggles of working Class Liverpool.

Early career, working as a youth worker while breaking into the entertainment industry is where Jernice joined a movement of Liverpool creatives, Urbeatz. Urbeatz was run by black creatives and created platforms for digital arts, visual arts, events, conversation, documentaries, magazines and music.

With opportunities and confidence is when Jernice embarked on her TV careers, working on hard hitting tv shows such as Ross Kemp on Gangs and lighter entertainment Britain's Got Talent, Dragon Den, X Factor.

Now an award-winning Documentary Producer of Routes jukebox, a creator of Black Girls Brunch and running a Business 0483, her creative aim is to highlight conversations, development and importance of Black Talent and excellences.

Working in the TV industry has enabled Jernice to work in 15 different countries, filming and producing on location for companies such as BBC, ITV, CH5, Discovery, NBC and many more.

Tom works across genres outside mainstream pop and have a track record of delivering massive audience awareness and UK and global chart success.

For the past 4 years, Tom has been Co-President of Decca Records, part of Universal Music Group. Decca is 95yrs old and one of the most important labels in the history of recorded music. It is the global market leader for specialist and mainstream classics & jazz but also works across other music genres. He's 2x winner of Music Business Worldwide's A&R of the year and have conceived and led global marketing campaigns delivering well in excess of 20 million album sales for some of the world's most successful classical & jazz artists – Andrea Bocelli (the world's most successful classical singer); Ball & Boe (3x number 1 albums); Jacob Collier; Katherine Jenkins (multi Classical Brit winner); Jamie Cullum (helped launch his 2.5m selling major label debut album Twentysomething); Ludovico Einaudi (the world's most successful living classical composer); Luciano Pavarotti; Max Richter; Olafur Arnalds; Nigel Kennedy; Andre Rieu etc. Tom has also worked with alternative acts including The Lumineers

& Aurora and mainstream superstars Diana Ross (her Glastonbury legends slot); Ronan Keating; Rod Stewart & Robert Plant. And, he works with the world's leading core classical artists and their management teams including Lise Davidsen, Yunchan Lim, Vikingur Olafsson, the Kanneh-Mason family, Lang Lang amongst many others.
